To link with our topic of Super, Duper, You, we have been thinking about where we live. We talked about our homes and how they were the same or different to others. We then drew our homes. We have also been developing our fine motor skills by using scissors to cut out abstract facial features and create abstract faces.



Year 1s have been learning about the work of Pablo Picasso in Art. We looked closely at some of his famous abstract portraits and discussed his use of colour, shape and lines. Next, we had a go at experimenting with our own use of lines and shape by playing a game of roll a Picasso face. The children did an amazing job of creating their own abstract portraits!

## Year 4/5/6

Y456 have had another super busy - and very productive - week! In Science we planned and carried out a fabulous friction investigation to test how different materials impacted upon the distance that a toy car travelled when released from a ramp. We learned all about variables and the way in which we use them to ensure that a test is fair (ask your child about 'Cows Moo Softly!) We then linked this to our Maths learning by calculating the average distance travelled by the car on each of its three trips down the ramp, per material type. In English we wrote incredibly moving diary entries, in role as Abilene - the owner of Edward Tulane. He has, unfortunately, been thrown overboard and is currently languishing on the sea bed... Will he ever be seen again? In Art we created stunningly accurate self portraits, using mirrors and oil pastels, and have displayed them on our staircase. We also enjoyed a fun, informative trip to the York Food Festival, during which we made (and ate!) chocolate lollipops, made our own butternut squash ravioli (yum!) and even recorded a jingle for YorkMix radio.
