Year 4/5/6

Y456 have done lots of amazing Science learning this week around friction, fair testing, interpreting the results of our investigations and writing clear conclusions. In Maths y45 have mastered subtraction using exchanging whilst y6 have honed their long multiplication skills. In English we have been drawing and describing a particularly unpleasant character from our novel - Lolly - who the children consider to be 'intimidating, ignorant and disrespectful'!
