## Acorn Class



What a busy week! On Tuesday, we had a STEM day focusing on protecting our planet. We had an interactive session where we learnt about how we could help save our oceans. Following this, we worked as a class, to create different sea creatures for our very own ocean and to spread our message about plastic pollution. This week has also been anti-bullying week, so we wore odd socks on Tuesday to celebrate differences. On Thursday, Alexis came in to show us how to make salt-dough tree decorations which will be put on show in York Minster at Christmas.



**Year 2/3** We have been continuing with our dragon descriptions this week and they are coming on brilliantly! On Tuesday we had a day away from our dragons for our STEM day. This year's theme was Protect our Planet and we took part in some live, interactive sessions on oceans and rainforests. After the sessions, we reflected on what we had been inspired to do to help save these environments. The children made leaflets to show how they will be the change they want to see.



Year 4/5/6
Y456 loved their two 'Protect Our Planet 2024' interactive sessions this week. We joined livestreams direct from the Eden project and learned all about the work of marine ecologists and the importance of tropical rainforests to our planet. Inspired by this, we then wrote beautiful poems on the theme 'Our planet, our home, our actions'. After that, we had a fabulous online painting tutorial with renowned artist John Dyer who creates much of his work in the Amazon rainforest! With his help, we created stunning rainforest landscapes which we are incredibly proud of. We also marked Anti Bullying Week in our Life Skills lesson, watching and discussing a range of film clips on this year's theme of 'Choose Respect' then making posters to showcase our views of what respect means. In topic we learned about when and why World War One began and which countries were involved, ahead of our trip to Castle Museum on Tuesday. In English we had a really close look at four different covers of our new novel, Room 13, and based upon those alone we made predictions about the story. We're pretty sure it's going to be a spine tingling page turner!!
