We have had a Roarsome week continuing our learning on our dinosaur descriptions and they are terrific! We also enjoyed re-telling the story of Gigantosaurus as we ordered pictures of the events of the story into chronological order.

**Year 2/3** It has been another busy week in Willow Class. We have been practicing our Christingle Service songs and will be featured on the York Music Hub Christmas tree at York Minster. Each participating school has recorded their children singing and if you scan the QR code on the Naburn bauble, you will be able to hear the children singing.

On Tuesday, Willow's Year 3s visited the York Castle Museum as part of our WW1 topic. We learnt about life during the war and experienced signing up, travelling to London and life in the trenches. We had a wonderful and very educational afternoon!









Year 4/5/6
Y456 have had a jam-packed week full of fun and learning! On Tuesday we had a moving, informative trip to Castle Museum's permanent World War One exhibition -'1914: When the world changed forever'. It really brought this period of history to life for our children, with its army uniforms, kit bag contents, propaganda posters and newspaper front pages, glass eyes (!) and trench reconstruction. We now have a much clearer idea of the worldwide impact of The Great War and followed our trip up with some fabulous writing - both in Topic (adding accurate captions to photos of many WW1 artefacts) and in English (creating a detailed recount of all that we saw and learned on our trip). In Maths we have had a Fractiontastic few days, studying equivalence, simplification / mixed and improper numbers. Y6 again demonstrated their clear explanation skills whilst mentoring Y45 during part of Thursday's lesson - super to see (and hear)! In Art, we learned all about the life and work of renowned WW1 battlefield artist, John Nash, and recreated one of his famous 'no man's land' scenes in pastel. Aren't they amazing? In Music, we're studying that 1914 wartime classic, 'Keep the home fires burning' and we also enjoyed another 'crafty' afternoon with the PTA, putting the finishing touches to our Christmas baubles. Thankyou so much to Alexis and team for giving us this opportunity. Last, but not least, we are now fully immersed in our new novel: Room 13. It's all starting to get a little bit creepy upstairs ...
