


Acorn Class

We love sharing books and stories that we enjoy and just spending some quiet time together. Today, we took on the Lego Challenge and created dragons ready for our new class novel when we come back after half term!



Year 4/5/6 Year 456 have worked incredibly hard this week to complete a range of assessments which will help us to help them even more next term.
