




On Tuesday we found a suitcase left in our classroom.

We had our detective hats on at the beginning of the week as we predicted what might happen and the children have been creating some amazing similes to describe some of the beautiful illustrations in the book.

It has been wonderful to see the children return with such a positive attitude to life and learning - and very fitting, given this term's focus upon our school value of aspiration!
