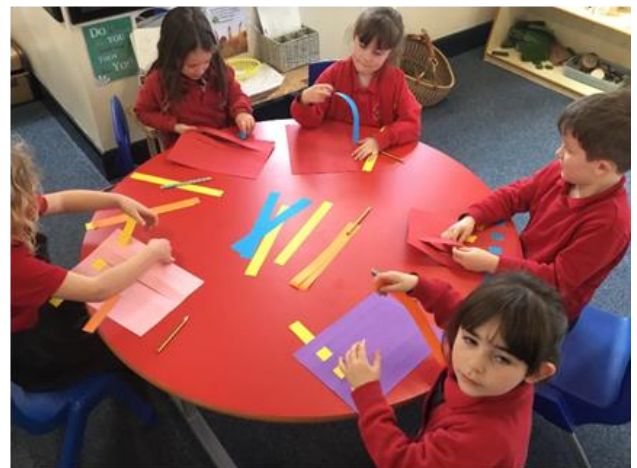

KS2 got together this week to discuss the 'TEAL Big Question' for this term: a question that all TEAL schools put to their children. One of TEAL's core values is 'Standing shoulder to shoulder'. The children discussed what this meant to them: Listening carefully to each other and valuing everyone's voice; accepting that everyone is unique and enjoys different experiences; lending a helping hand to someone facing difficulty; or another option.

The discussion was very thoughtful and included the idea of combining all three options and working together as a team. Some children thought that it could mean having a protective blanket around us as a group of schools and always having someone to catch us if we fall.
