Clubs finish next week (they are not on the following week). (Lorraine's after school club is on as usual).

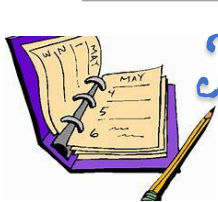

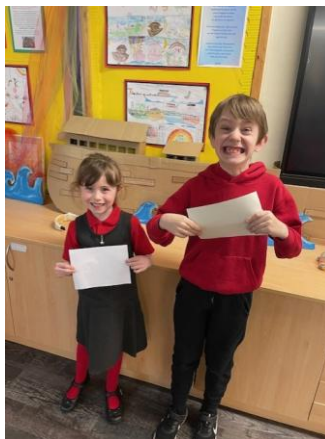

Love does not cause harm, steal or deliberately break The Ten Commandments.

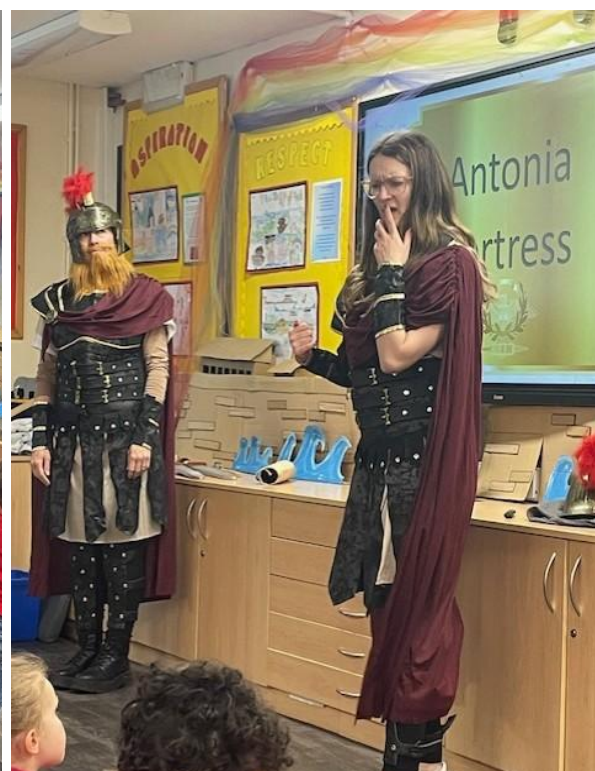
Love always looks after and respects everyone, supports and will always protect.
